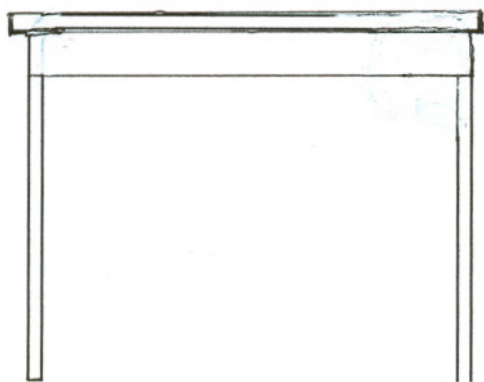

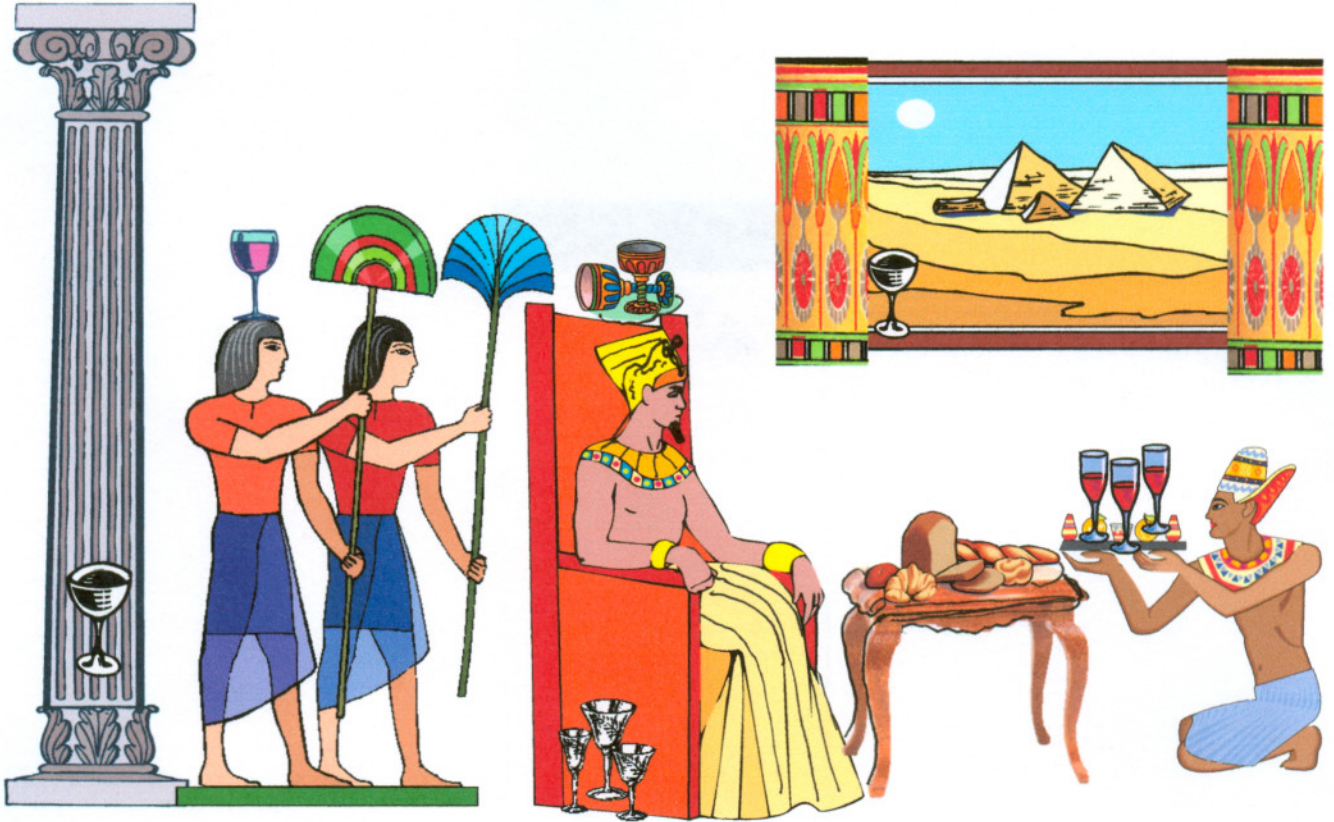
1. Was Joseph put in jail because he was a bad person or because a bad person told a lie about him?

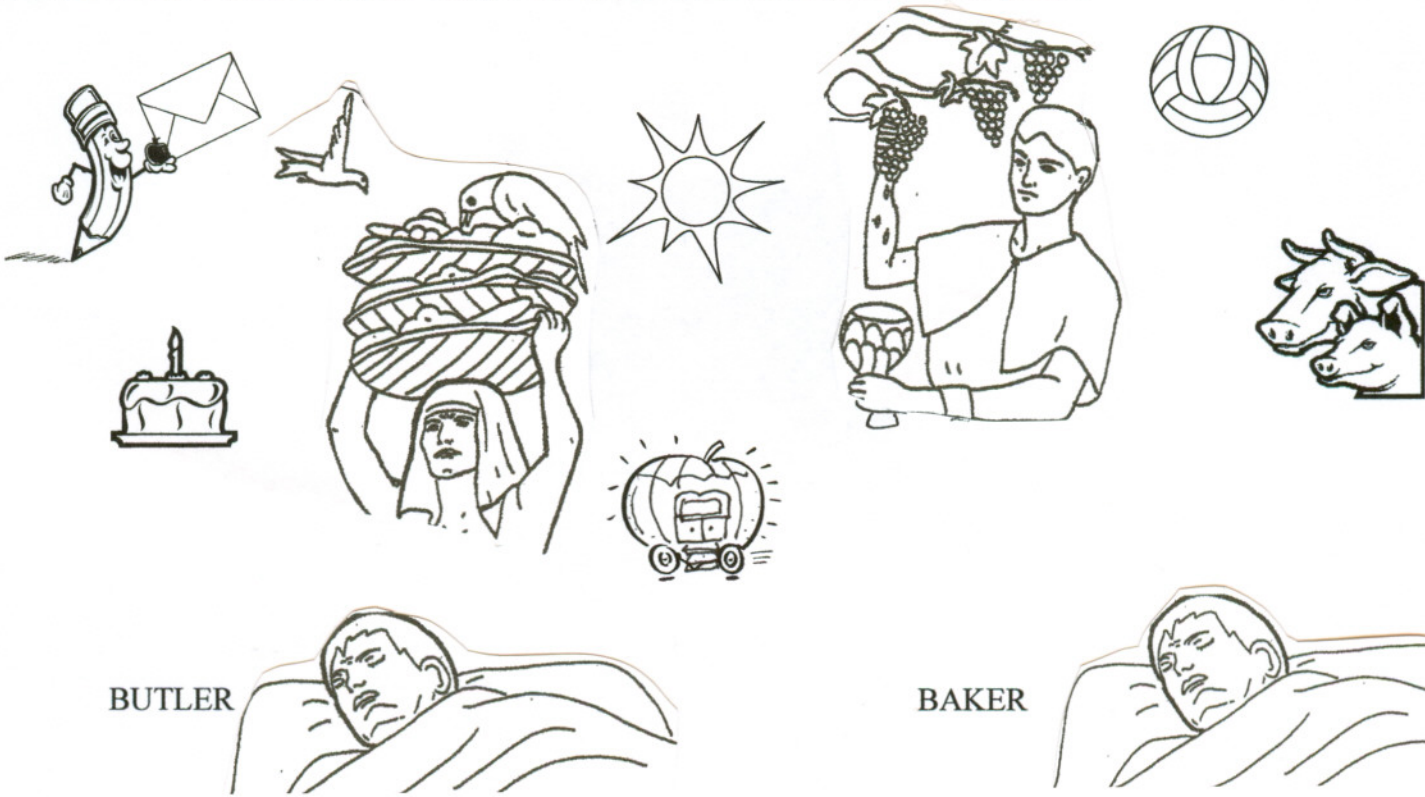
